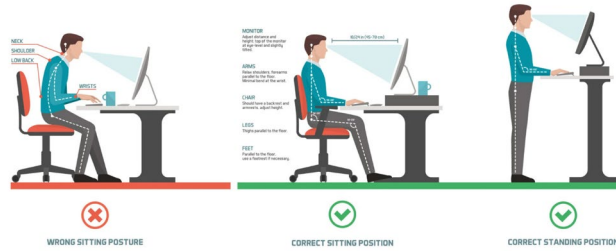

Tours, events and visits, and site safety:

The Communications & Engagement Division is responsible for the procedures and policies governing tours and VIP events at TRIUMF, including the **public tours program, various stakeholder tours, large-scale VIP visits, staff-led tours, etc.** We work across TRIUMF to provide thousands of tour experiences per year and enable the TRIUMF community to give their own tours.

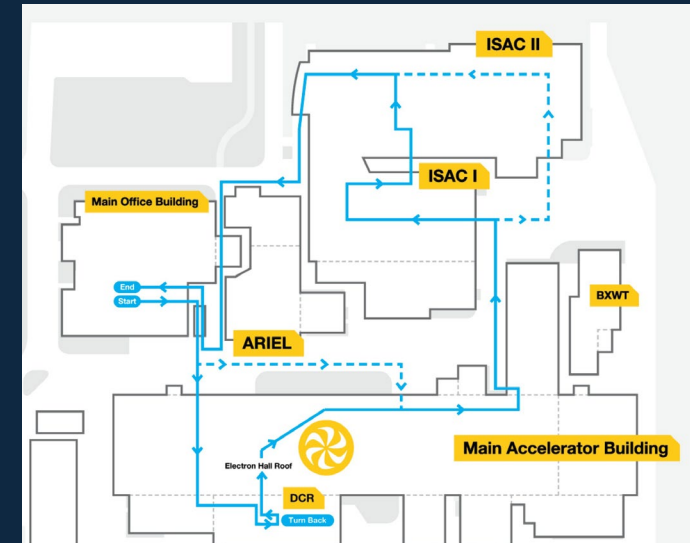
Tour route safety is a collective responsibility. The tour route is one of the single most travelled routes on site and must be kept clear of obstructions and hazards as much as possible.

Tour and event safety considerations:

- If your planned work will significantly impede the tour route, **please notify Communications.** We operate at least 4-5 tours per week, including for public, schools, and VIPs.

For staff-led tours:

- **Be aware of changes to route/configuration:** crane work, ledges and open areas, etc., and always obey posted signage (cranes, etc.) and watch for vehicles (trucks, forklifts, dollies or handcarts, etc.) when traversing site.
- **Any deviation from the public tour route must be flagged in advance** on the Tour Request form. Tour organizers must also confirm with DCR and check with the Hall/Facility Coordinator about specific hazards or considerations for that date/time.
- If possible, **pre-walk routes shortly before a tour, and when on tour, try to proactively flag hazards for guests** (i.e., uneven walkways, steep stairs, etc.)
